Outreach Information

Dear Neighbors,

I hope you are doing well. It is turning out to be a wonderful fall. Fall is my favorite season with the cool and crisp weather in addition to the leaves changing.

We had a great group of folks that came to the Outreach Coffee Hour with Susan De Rosa, Lifeline Marketing Supervisor from Beth Israel Lahey Hospital, Winchester Hospital and special guest, Lt. Mike Labriola from the Stoneham Fire Department to talk about fall prevention and personal medical alert systems known as Medical Guardian. A lot of great questions were asked and the conversation kept flowing. For those who have missed the opportunity due to other circumstances, please see the list of questions that were asked if you were interested in attending.

What is National Falls Prevention week? It is a public health observance that takes place annually to raise awareness of the impact of falls and how to prevent them. This year it's September 23-27th.

What is a medical alert system? A medical alert system is a device that connects the user to emergency services or a contact in the event of an emergency. They are knowns as personal emergency response systems (PERS).

What are the personal emergency response systems that Winchester Hospitals called? Medical Guardian

How many different devices that Medical Guardian has? They have a few options-wrist and neck pendant that can detect falls and ones that don't and a mobile neck pendant option that has a GPS capability.

How much does Medical Guardian cost and does insurance pay? Insurance companies do not pay for medical alert devices. There are a couple of different packages ranging from \$35.00 to 65.00 per month depending on your needs and if you have a landline vs cellular service. If you want more information on packages, please call (781) 438-1157.

This may be a great options for you or a loved one to have in case of an emergency. Medical alert systems help you remain independent and keep you safe in your home and in the community.
