

# **INCOME TAX PREPARATION**

Stoneham Senior Center is proud to cosponsor the AARP Foundation Tax Aide Program each year for the benefit of our community. The AARP Foundation is the charitable arm of AARP, with a mission to foster economic and social opportunities especially among older adults. Its Tax Aide program provides valuable assistance to taxpayers through a volunteer workforce of dedicated and trained tax preparation counselors. These services are free and open to taxpayers on a non-discriminatory basis. AARP membership is not required.

The Stoneham Senior Center Tax Aide program will operate on Tuesdays during the tax season, from February 3rd through April 7th, 2026. We will be scheduling appointments for the 2025 tax year after the New Year's holiday.
